

WIGHTON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING
held on MONDAY 16th NOVEMBER 2020

Due to the Coronavirus shutdown the meeting took place by **E-MAIL** following the circulation of an Agenda based on the Minutes and Matters Arising from the August 2020 meeting plus Finance/Precept, Playing Field, Planning, Correspondence and Any Other Business.

Minutes and Matters Arising: Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 10th August 2020 were approved and signed by the Chairman.

Wighton Common: Cllr.G.Brett-Reynolds reported that the Common grass has been cut.

Church Clock: The Church clock has been repaired and is now back in place on the church tower.

Finance/Precept: Payments have been made to:

It was agreed that the Parish Council request a Precept of £4000.00 for the financial year 1st April.2021 – 31st March 2022.

Playing Field: Cllr.S.Trend said that she felt Mr.Dennis Francis had made a good job of the playing field maintenance this year and that we should renew the contract. This year he charged £85 per visit and the total cost of £915.00 shared equally by the Parish Council and the Playing Field Committee. As Mr.Francis now knows the work required to maintain the playing field his charge will be increased to £95 per visit All councillors agreed to the additional charge and that the contract renewed.

Planning: Ref: PF/20/2084 - Demolition of existing front and rear porch, erection of two storey and single storey front extensions, roof conversion/replacement, rear dormer and cartshed. Forge House, High Street, Wighton, NR23 1AL. After viewing the plans on the Planning Dept.website no objections were raised and NNDC Planning Department advised accordingly.

Correspondence: All correspondence received was forwarded to the Councillors via the internet for their information and action as appropriate.

Any Other Business: Cllr.G.Brett-Reynolds reported that Highways had spent 2/3 days working by the bus shelter and it appeared that drainage pipes had been installed in an effort to alleviate the flooding there following heavy rain.
